The Catholic Church missions claimed most of the land in the area of the missions. After Mexico gained their independence, the Mexican Government forced the Catholic Church to give their land to the people. The Church gave their land to many of the local families, like the Peralta's, Vallejo's, Alviso's, Higuera's and many other Catholic families. For the past 10 years I have been judging Junior and/or senior high school History Day projects for Alameda County. When I first started there were no entries from Fremont, Union City or Newark. I am happy to report that we now have two high schools

and one junior high school all in Fremont, submitting History Day Projects. For the past 8 years I have judged Historic Documentaries and these have become better and better each year. I am, also happy to report that many of our members have renewed their membership with Washington Township Historical Society. I will be working with the Museum of Local History, Mission Peak Heritage Foundation and us to see if we can put out a joint newsletter.
