Merging of Historical Groups

Our efforts to merge the Washington Township Historical Society, Mission Peak Heritage Foundation and the Washington Township Museum of Local History have not been successful.

However, an effort to create a "Passport to Adventure" program with nine historical organizations working together for this one program has met with good success so far. The nine historical organizations are: Children's Natural History Museum, Olive Hyde Art Gallery, Old Mission San Jose Museum, Niles Essanay Silent Film Museum, Niles Depot, Niles Railway, Patterson House, Shinn House, and the Washington Township Museum of Local History. This program is geared to the younger folks in our community, but I am reasonably sure that not too many adults have visited all nine sites. Upon completion of the program by visiting all nine sites, the participant receives a certificate that declares that they are a "Passport to Adventure Historian". Since our young people live on social media, this program is being promoted on Facebook and probably some other social media programs.

It is exciting to be involved with a program that has nine historical organizations working together on one project. Does this mean that these organizations will work together on other projects, Who Knows?
